Scholarships

Two families who loved CHCS, the Falkensteins and the Row/Steele families, each donated \$10,000 to start our scholarship fund. We have been awarding two scholarships annually to graduating seniors who are from CHCS clinic towns and pursuing a healthcare career. Our hope is to raise enough funds to award one scholarship to a senior from each clinic town using just the earnings of the fund.

- The fund balance as of November 2022 is \$33,035. \$100,000 is needed.
- We awarded two \$500 scholarships in 2022 to graduating seniors Madie Wilt from Holton High School and Kaylee Lukert from St. Marys High School.

Jeans for a cause

We continued our popular program to allow associates to donate \$10 per month to wear jeans on Friday, plus we updated the process to allow associates to pay for more than one month at a time. Associates donated \$1,350 to various Greater Giving funds through Jeans for a Cause from March through November 2022. Need a form? Talk to your manager.

Comfort Closet

A little bit of caring goes a long way. This fund pays for little things that can make a big difference to someone – quick and confidential personal care items that help our patients feel safe and comfortable. Since November 2021, the Comfort Closet committee has approved 9 requests for assistance and has purchased edema wear, an automatic medication box, a commode, an Acapella device, a nebulizer treatment, a post-op shoe, a bathroom toilet mat, a U bar for a bathroom, and groceries for a patient in isolation at home with no support.
